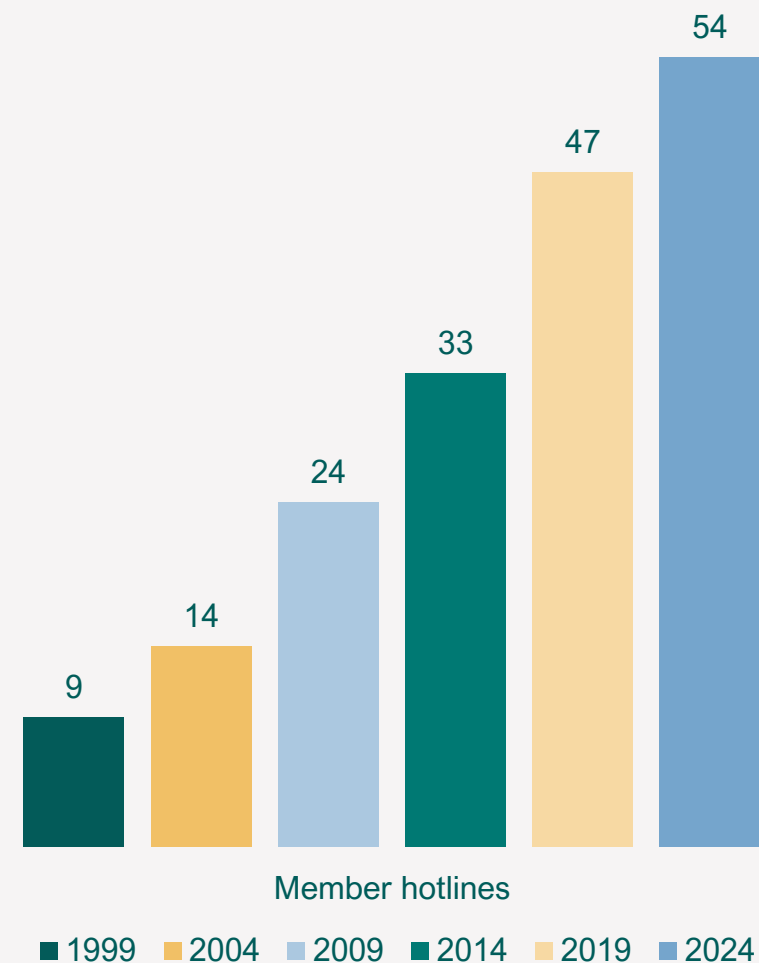

## Who we are

- The network consists of **54 hotlines in 50 countries** (as of April 2024) that provide the public with a way to anonymously report illegal content online with a focus on CSAM.
- Hotline analysts trained by INTERPOL classify the illegality of material. Confirmed CSAM is removed via the countries Notice and Takedown procedure.

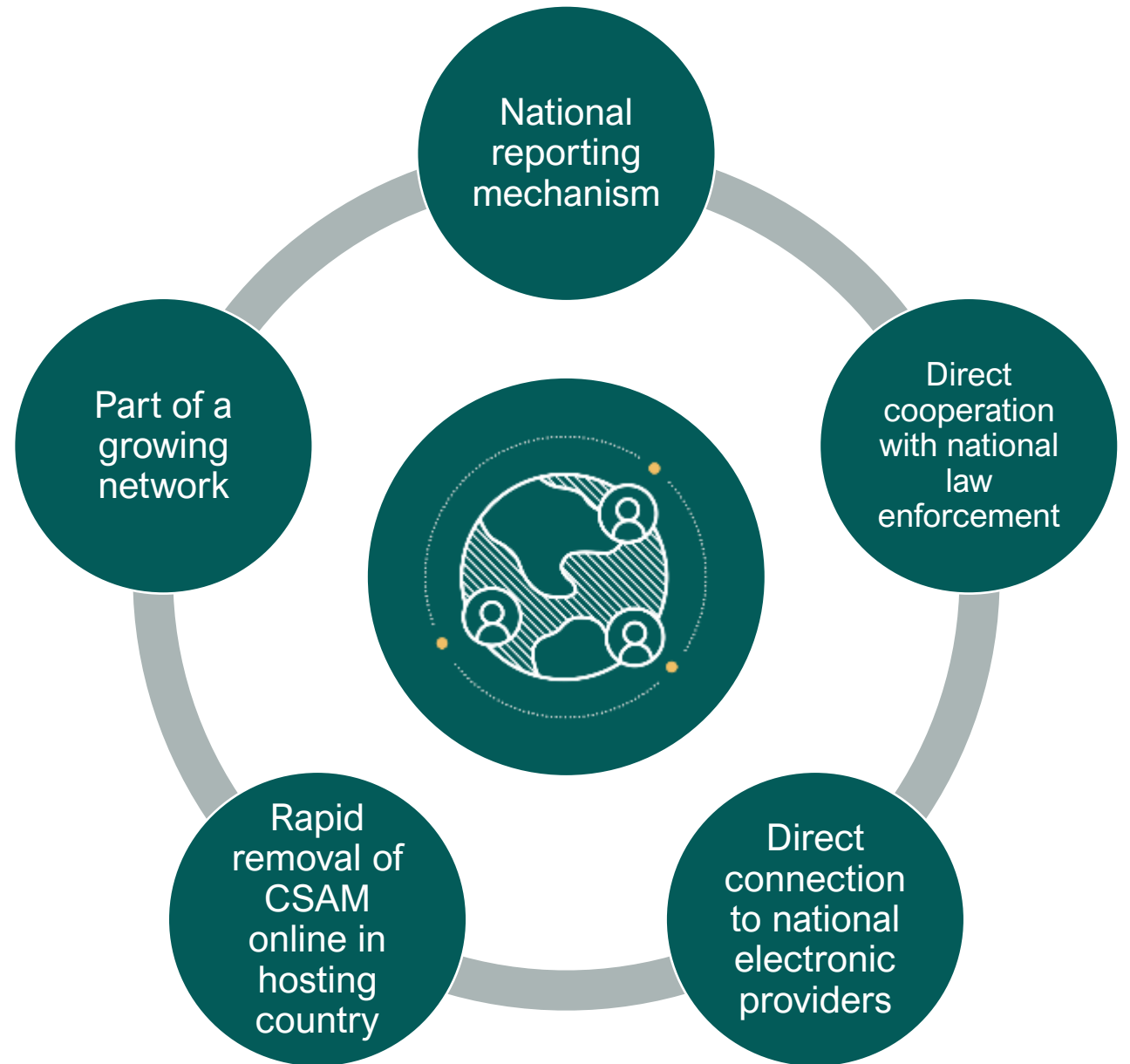

# The role of our hotlines

---

## Hotlines:

- Enable the public to anonymously report online material they suspect may be illegal
- Act as a triage function of LEAs and help in building intelligence
- Build trusted relationships with the industry
- Are part of an international network: Interpol, NCMEC, Meta, Google...etc





# Importance of hotlines!

- On average it takes **2,5 days** to take down CSAM in a country **WITH** a hotline

**versus**

- 28 days in countries **WITHOUT** a hotline.





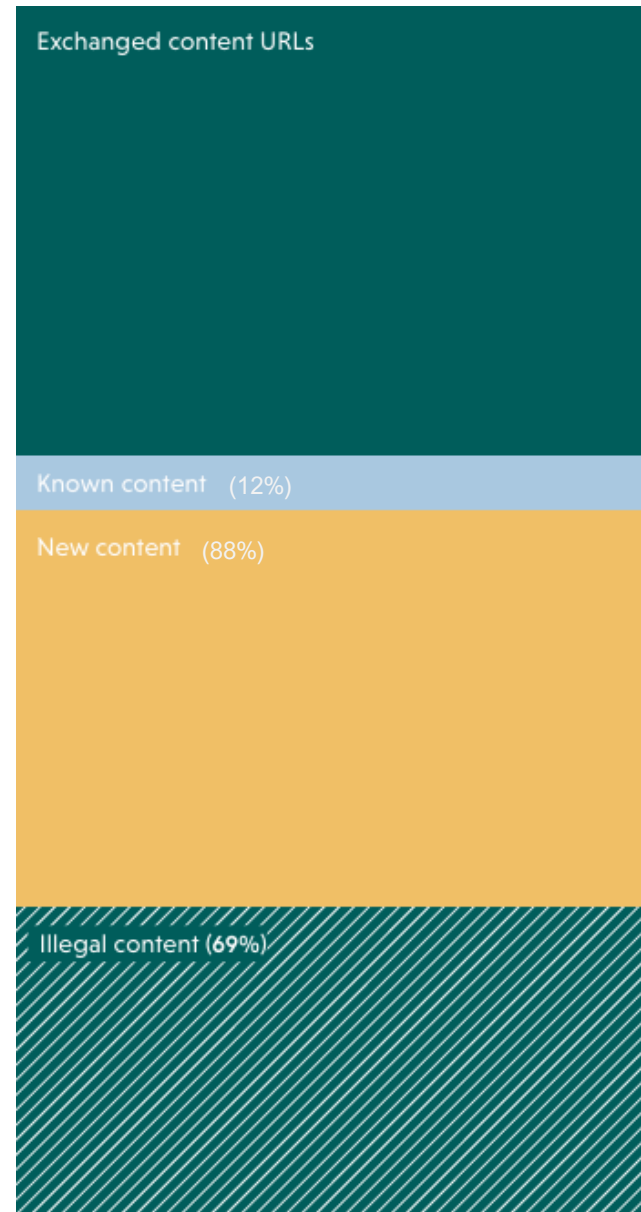

# Number of Reports

- **785 thousand** exchanged content URLs – number of URLs of individual media files exchanged via ICCAM.
- 88% New content URLs – number of content URLs of reported content assessed by an analyst and categorised by ICCAM as new or ‘previously unseen.’
- 69% Illegal content URLs – number of unique content URLs processed via ICCAM and assessed by analysts as being CSAM and thus illegal.



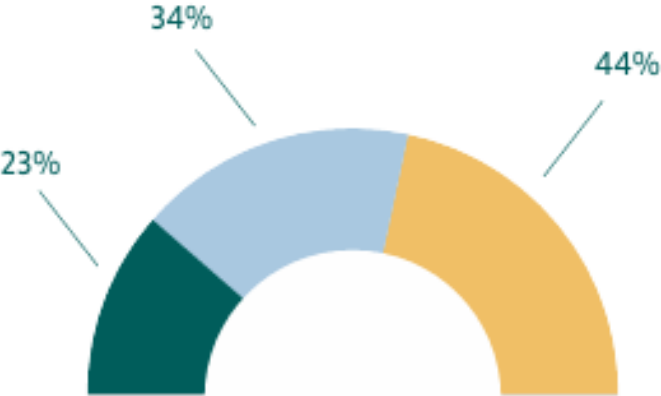

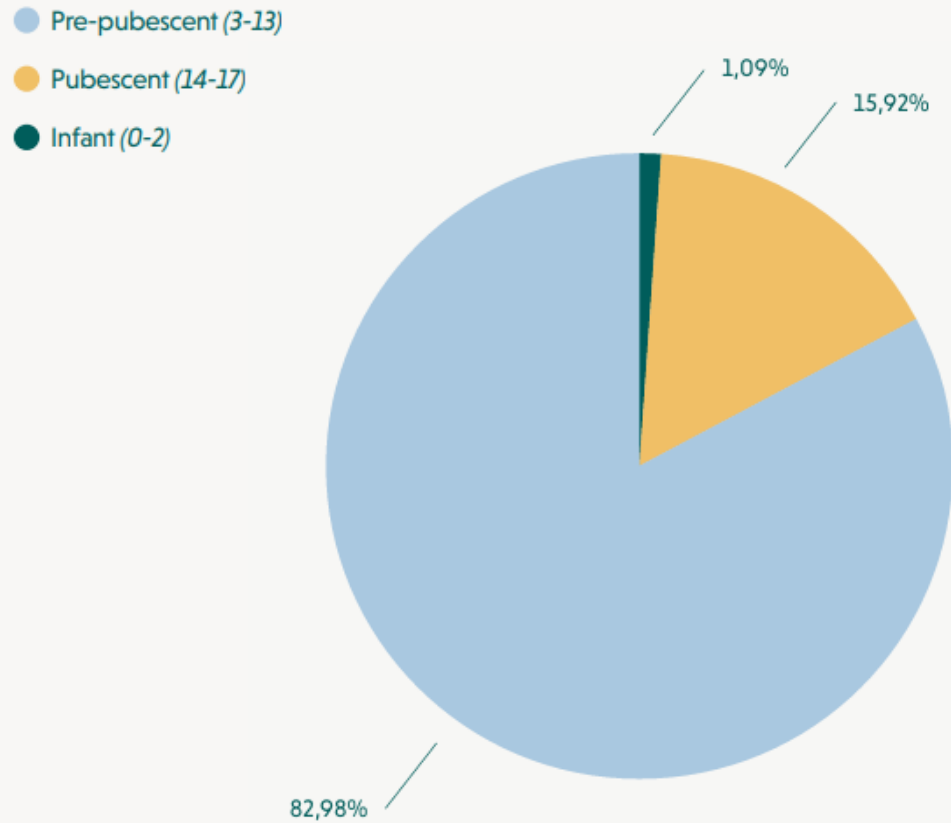

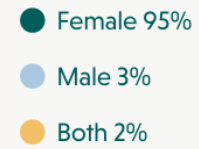

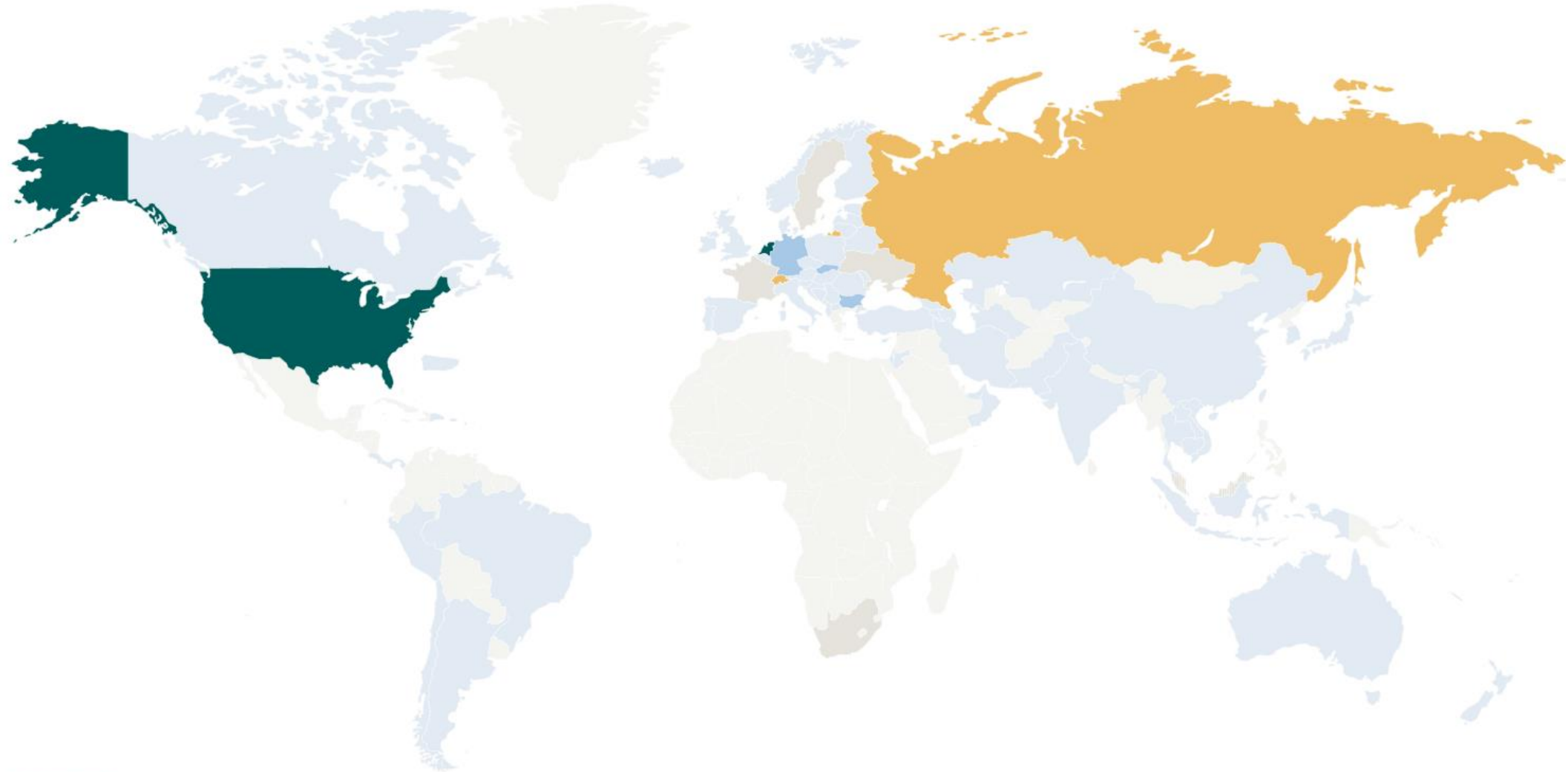
# Age of Victims



# Gender of Victims



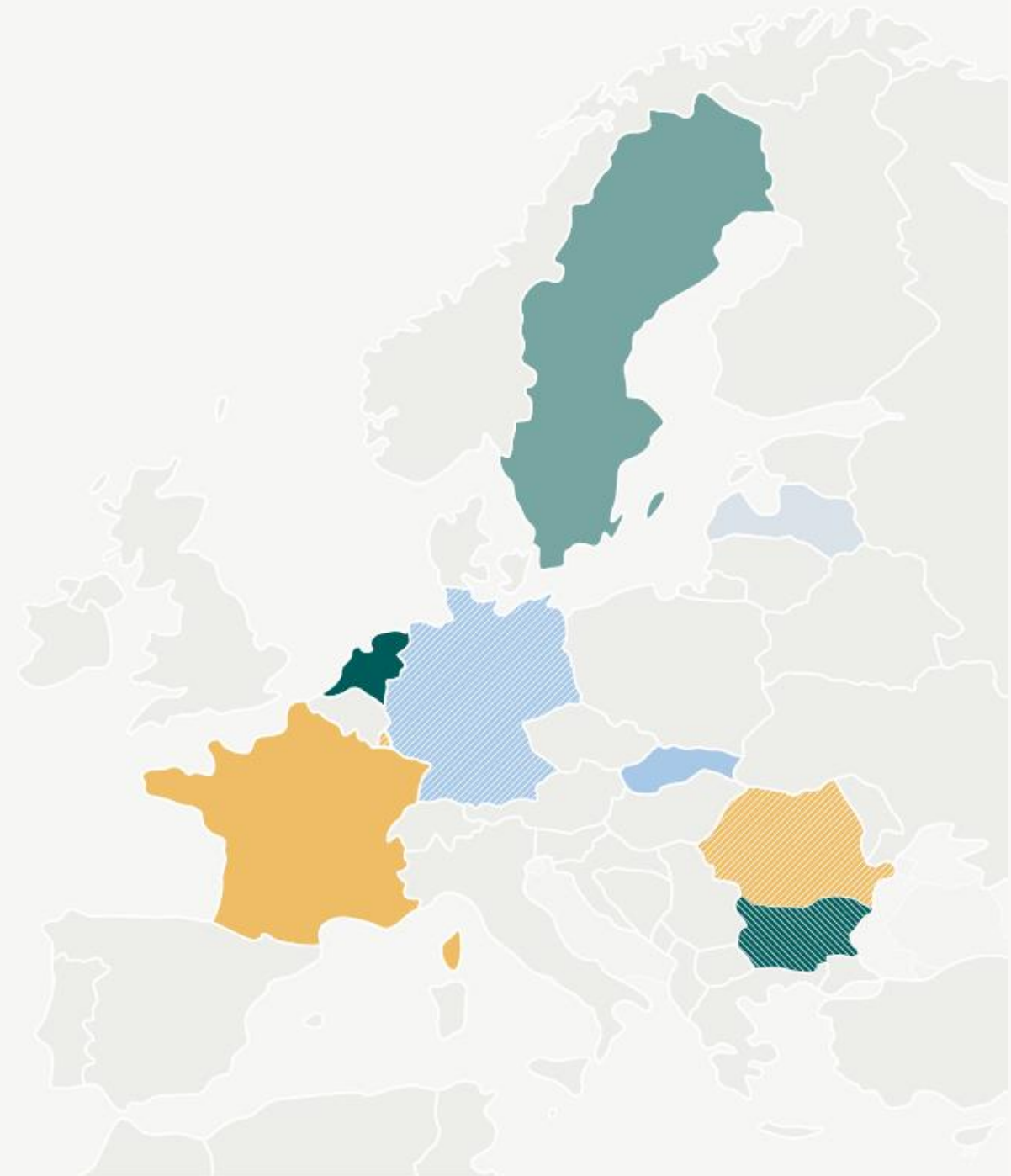
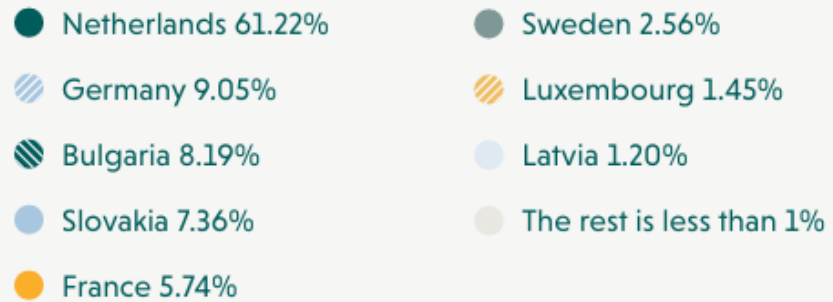
# Worldwide hosting & illegal patterns

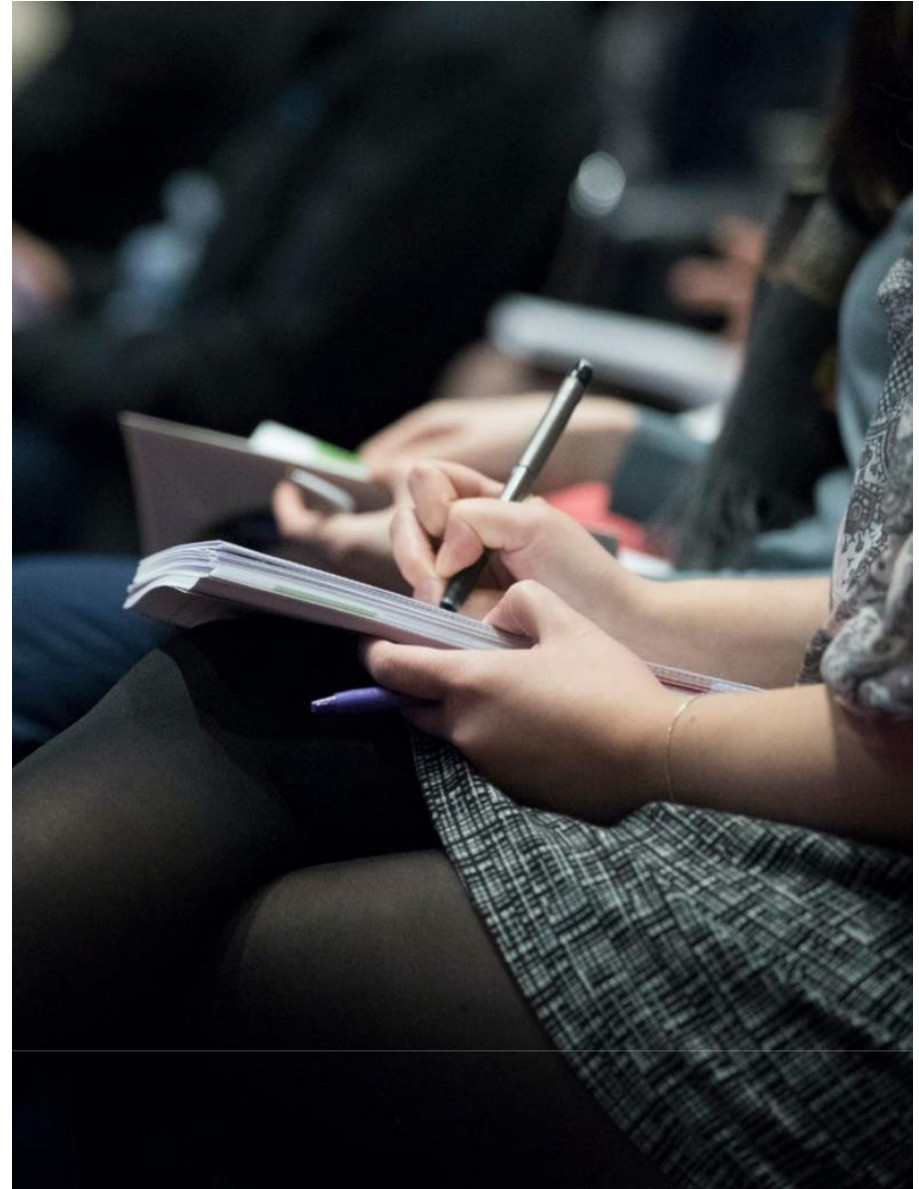

# ICCAM

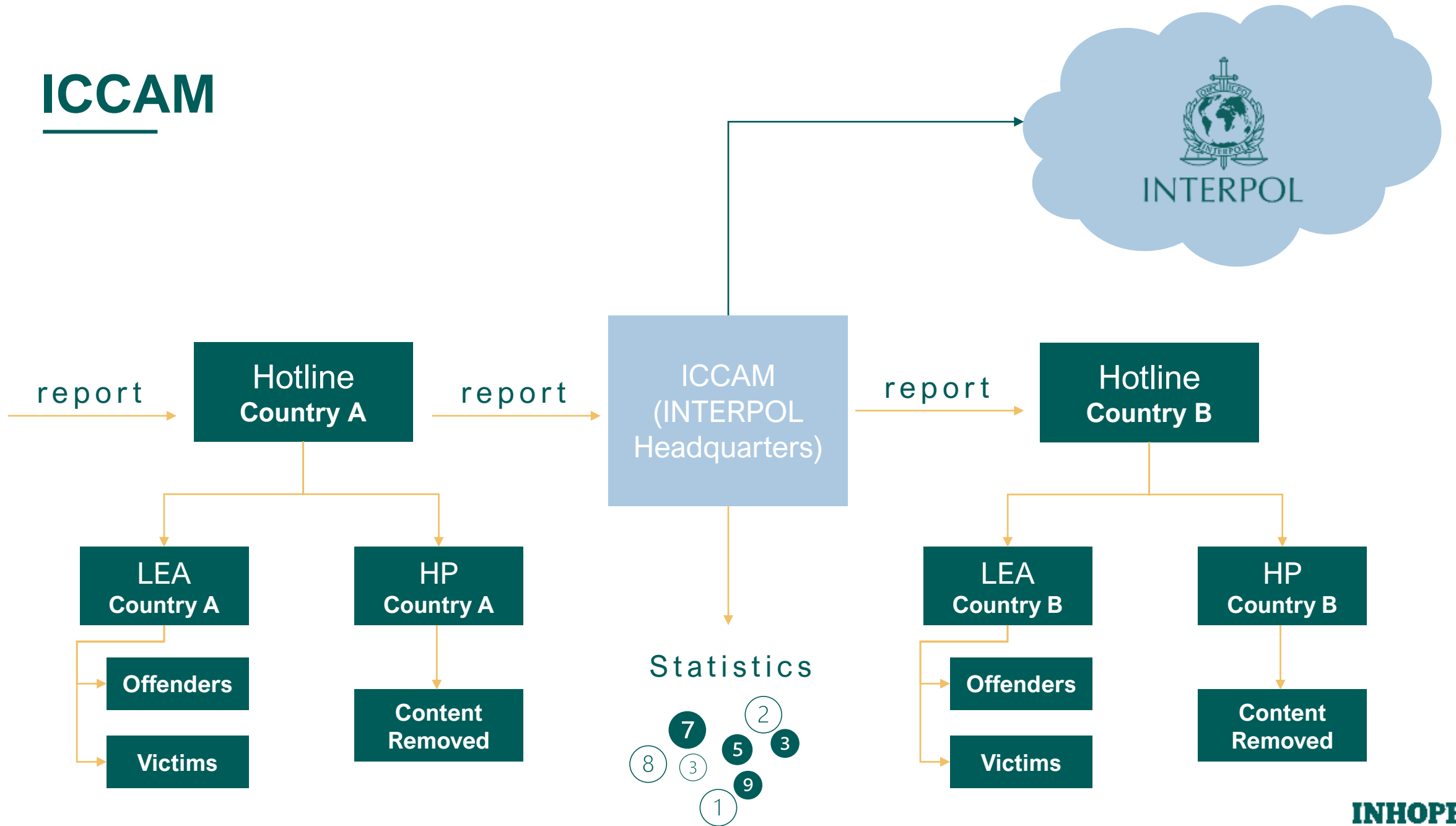
- "I see CAM".
- Exchange of reports in 50 jurisdictions.
- 250 hotline analysts users.
- Processing 1 million content items /year.
- Known content and ICSE matches: not seen by analysts.
- Illegal content shared with INTERPOL.

- The Stronger Together project supports the coordination of the INHOPE network of hotlines by strengthening our capacity building and awareness-raising work.
- Activities include peer-to-peer visits, advanced analysts trainings

# Stronger Together

## Advocacy:

- Recast of the CSAM Directive: authorising hotlines to engage in:
  - receive and analyse suspected CSAM reports;
  - notify law enforcement authorities about illegal content;
  - collaborate with organisations authorised to receive CSAM reports in other countries;
  - conduct searches on publicly accessible material to detect the dissemination of CSAM
- DSA: Trusted flaggers mechanism

# Google.org & Meta

- Support for network expansion activities.
- Strengthen INHOPE's efforts in target regions, namely Africa, Central Asia (the Stans) and MENA.
- INHOPE provides support to prospective hotlines: including how to raise awareness in the country about the need for a national hotline, roundtables with the relevant industry, law enforcement, and government stakeholders in each country; trainings on content assessment and report management implementing the necessary security measures to safely operate a hotline.



## Other INHOPE Projects

- Project CPORT: creating a Law enforcement portal into ICCAM
- Universal Classification Schema: developing a common ontology of CSAM categorisation which will facilitate automated translation between and among different categorisation schemas in use globally and across sectors
- AviaTor: creating a tool for LEAs to process and prioritise industry reports from NCMEC
